LENTEN REGULATIONS

Good Friday is March 21st.

Catholics in the United States are obliged to abstain from meat and fast on Good Friday.

Fasting. On a day of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but, together, they should not equal the other full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are permitted.

Abstinence. On days of abstinence, eating meat is not allowed.

The obligation of fasting binds Catholics who are 18-59 years old. The obligation of abstinence applies to those 14 years and older. The law does not oblige when health or ability to work would be seriously affected.

What is involved in becoming Catholic? RCIA is the process that Catholic Church uses to help those who have never been baptized, and those who have been baptized in other Christian traditions, to discern the call to become a member of the Catholic Church. The group meets throughout the year on Sunday mornings at 9:00 am to learn about Catholic teaching, traditions, prayer and life. RCIA is not a course or program, but rather a discernment process where participants can openly ask questions and explore specific areas.
