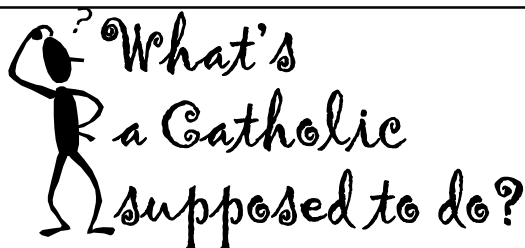

The proponents are calling their Initiative-1000 campaign "Death With Dignity." The Catholic Church teaches that physician-assisted suicide "can never be excused, even if it is requested."

What is involved in becoming Catholic? RCIA is the process that Catholic Church uses to help those who have never been baptized, and those who have been baptized in other Christian traditions, to discern the call to become a member of the Catholic Church. The group meets throughout the year on Sunday mornings at 9:00 am to learn about Catholic teaching, traditions, prayer and life. RCIA is not a course or program, but rather a discernment process where participants can openly ask questions and explore specific areas.
