

From the Pastoral Coordinator

As was announced at all the Masses last weekend, Fr. Paul Pluth will be completing his three-year assignment here at St. Anne at the end of June. Archbishop Brunett has assigned Fr. Paul as the Parochial Vicar for Mary Queen of Peace Parish in Sammamish; he will also continue his full-time work as Director of the Archdiocesan Tribunal.

Beginning July 1, Archbishop Brunett has named Fr. John Bowman as Parochial Vicar here at St. Anne. Fr. Bowman is currently pastor of St. Luke Parish in Shoreline. As Parochial Vicar he will be serving our parish, as Fr. Paul has, in liturgical and pastoral ministry. I will be continuing as Pastoral Coordinator.

A letter from Archbishop Brunett about this change was included in last weekend's bulletin. Additional copies are available at the doors of the church.

I want to thank Fr. Paul for his years of service to our community, and wish him every blessing. We will have a special reception for Fr. Paul after the 10:00 Mass on Sunday, June 21.

It was also announced in this week's *Progress* that a new Priest Moderator has been appointed for St. Anne. The Priest Moderator is authorized by the Archbishop to sign documents for the parish which, by canon law, require a priest's signature (such as sacramental records and annual reports). Fr. Bill McKee served as Priest Moderator for St. Anne for the past three years; as of July 1 he will be serving as Pastor of St. Vincent de Paul Parish in Federal Way. Fr. Steve Sallis, Pastor of St. Benedict Parish, has been assigned as our new Priest Moderator.

I know that all this can be confusing and that changes are challenging, for everyone concerned. To help us better understand how such appointments are decided I have asked Fr. Paul Magnano, the Vicar of Clergy for the Archdiocese, and Leigh Stringfellow, the Chief of Staff, to join us for a discussion of Parish Leadership on Thursday, June 12, 7:00 pm. This will address why we are experiencing more frequent transitions in pastoral leadership, why new configurations are necessary, and how appointments and decisions are made. This was a topic that came up repeatedly in the input from the Candid Conversations session, and so I hope that this presentation can help us better understand our current situation, and our future. Please make every effort to participate.
