

## From the Pastoral Coordinator

Summers are usually quiet times for families and parishes, but this summer is far from quiet this year at St. Anne.

The Church renovation project is well underway in the church interior. As has been announced before, this summer's work will encompass several main elements of the overall project: the replacement of the roof, installation of skylights, construction of the east-end wall, creation of the day chapel, the Eucharistic chapel and reconciliation chapel, painting of the ceiling and beams, construction of the nursery, installation of the baptismal font, and upgrading of the restrooms. The project is scheduled to be complete by Labor Day. In the meantime we will continue to gather in Banchemo Hall for our liturgies. Thank you to all who are contributing to our *Building on a Century of Faith* capital campaign to make this renovation possible.

Our Conversations about St. Anne Parish continue throughout these months. I want to thank those who have been participating in these sessions. Your presence, participation, time and energy are helping to make a difference in our community. Two more sessions discussing parish finances are scheduled for July 23 and 30 (see the announcement in this bulletin for more details). Summaries of the three sessions that have been held so far are available on our parish website.

Next weekend, July 5 - 6, will be the first weekend that our new parochial vicar, Fr. John Bowman will be with us. Please take time to introduce yourself and welcome him. We will have a welcoming reception for Fr. Bowman on July 13 after the 10 am Mass.
