***From the Pastoral Coordinator***

Since the end of May, we have held five community gatherings to talk about St. Anne Parish. 175 people participated in the Candid Conversations session in May, and the subsequent session on Parish Leadership and Parish Finances have been well attended. Summaries of these sessions are available on our parish website.

It's time now not only to talk about St. Anne's past and present, but our future. As we begin our second century, what should we be focusing on? What should we be doing?

To explore these questions we will be offering a series of **Conversation Cafés**—small informal gatherings where parishioners will be invited to share their thoughts, ideas and dreams for the future of our community. The Cafés will be hosted by members of our various councils and commissions, and will be held in their homes, local coffee shops or restaurants, or here at the parish. The format will be informal discussion around simple questions, giving each participant an opportunity to share her/his input about our community's future.

There will be nearly 100 *Conversation Cafés* offered between now and the end of October. We want to hear from everyone, and hope that every parishioner will be part of a Café. Someone will be contacting you soon to extend an invitation; dates of open Cafés will be listed in the bulletin.

As the summer progresses, so does the work on our **church renovation project**. The roof replacement is completed; interior walls are up, taped and mudded; finish work is being done on the baptismal font; and final details are being done on the skylights. Work continues on the nursery. Painting the walls and ceiling is still to be done. If you have questions or want more information, please stop by the table at the back of Banchemo Hall after Mass for more information. You can also follow the progress being made through pictures on our parish website. Thank you to all who are contributing to our *Building on a Century of Faith* capital campaign to make this renovation possible. If you haven't yet become part of the campaign, please consider joining us. Pledge envelopes are available at a table at the back of the hall or through the parish office.

**MARYKNOLL MISSIONARY AT ST. ANNE**

Maryknoll Missioner Father Tom Marti, a native of Seattle, will speak at Masses on the weekend of August 23-24. Father Tom graduated from O'Dea High School, Class of '55. He entered Maryknoll in 1955, and was ordained on June 12, 1965. He was then missioned to the Philippines, where he worked in rural parishes for 11 years. From 1976 until 1982, he was appointed as Director of the Maryknoll Justice and Peace Office in NY. Following this assignment, Fr. Tom returned to the Philippines for another five years. From 1989 to 1992 he served as the Executive Secretary of the Justice & Peace Commission of the Unions of Superiors General in Rome, Italy. From 1992 until 1998, he served as Director of the Maryknoll Mission Promotion House in Seattle. In 1998 he returned to Maryknoll Headquarters in NY where he served as both the Vocations Director & Coordinator of the Maryknoll Priest/Brother Associates. He is currently living in Seattle where he serves both Maryknoll and the Seattle Archdiocese.
