- Labor Day Weekend marks the launch of *Yes to Life* Month 2008, sponsored by the Bishops of Washington State. Initiative 1000, which would legalize assisted suicide, is on this November's ballot. 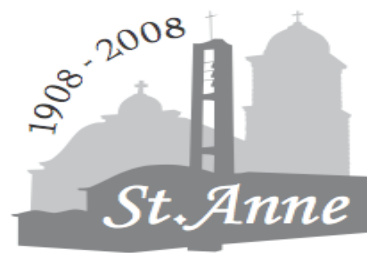
