**No to I-1000**

Initiative 1000, which is on this November's ballot, would legalize physician assisted suicide in Washington State.

I-1000 is contrary to Catholic teaching that all human life is sacred. It is also a bad law. It lacks adequate safeguards. There is no requirement that a spouse or family be notified that their loved one has requested assisted suicide. There is no requirement for a psychological evaluation, thus a depressed person could request and receive an overdose of drugs, instead of treatment. In addition, the "choice" of assisted suicide could become someone else's choice to cut costs, especially for people lacking adequate health insurance. We should offer true compassion and care, not a lethal drug overdose.

Please pray and reflect carefully before making your choices this election season. And then please vote!
