Ms. Gazarek's third graders, Mrs. Rodgers' 4th graders and Miss Dempsey's 5th graders would like to remind everyone that Martha Workers works all year providing once-weekly sandwiches and once-monthly dinners to the Family and Adult Services Center. They invite everyone to help. Martha's Workers' most important needs are **canned hams** and cans of **tuna**. They also need **pasta**, (rigatoni and penne only), **mayonnaise, mustard, relish, vinyl gloves, and plastic sandwich bags**. Anything helps but industrial sizes of everything are especially welcome. Collection bins are at the entrances to the church.
