Obtaining the Plenary Indulgence During the Year of St. Paul

Pope Benedict XVI will grant the faithful Plenary Indulgence for the occasion of the two-thousandth anniversary of the birth of the Apostle Paul. The Plenary Indulgence will be valid throughout the Pauline Year, 28 June 2008 to 29 June 2009. The conditions for obtaining the plenary indulgence include a pious visit in the form of a pilgrimage to the papal basilica of St. Paul in Rome and to pray in accordance with the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff.

The faithful who are unable to journey to Rome may still obtain the Plenary Indulgence if they meet all the conditions and visit one of the designated Holy Places in the Archdiocese of Seattle designated by Archbishop Brunett. For a copy of the conditions and a list of the designated sites, please call the parish office.

Have You Been Confirmed?

Many Catholics have never taken an important step in making their Catholic faith part of their adult lives: they have never been confirmed. One of the Sacraments of Initiation, Confirmation completes the process begun for many of us by our parents through baptism. It represents an adult decision to live as followers of Jesus. It strengthens us with the gifts of the Holy Spirit to grow in our faith and to mature in the way we live our daily lives.

Confirmation is an important part of living as a Catholic. In fact, it is so important that the Church requires that anyone asked to be a Godparent, RCIA Sponsor or Confirmation Sponsor must already be confirmed themselves.

An Adult Confirmation Preparation Program is beginning at St. Anne during Lent, in preparation for the celebration of the Sacrament with Bishop Tyson on May 9th.
