#### Have You Been Confirmed?

Many Catholics have never taken an important step in making their

Catholic faith part of their adult lives: they have never been confirmed. One of the Sacraments of Initiation, Confirmation completes the process begun for many of us by our parents through baptism. It represents an adult decision to live as followers of Jesus. It strengthens us with the gifts of the Holy Spirit to grow in our faith and to mature in the way we live our daily lives.

Confirmation is an important part of living as a Catholic. In fact, it is so important that the Church requires that anyone asked to be a Godparent, RCIA Sponsor or Confirmation Sponsor must already be confirmed themselves.

**An Adult Confirmation Preparation Program is beginning at St. Anne during Lent**, in preparation for the celebration of the Sacrament with Bishop Tyson on May 9th.
