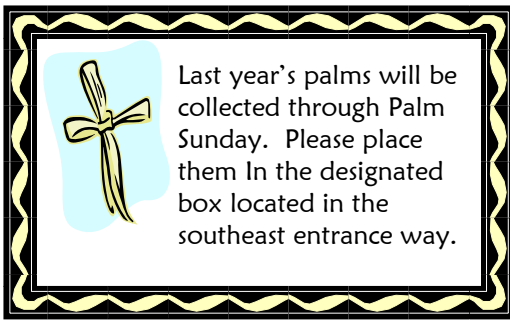
## St. Anne Mission & Vision Statements

These comments were used as the foundation to develop new Mission and Vision Statements for St. Anne Parish. We uncovered a variety of common themes voiced from many people. We learned that our parish membership is:

- pleased with the school and how it focuses on teaching Catholic values while providing educational excellence;
- dedicated to serving people in need.

On **Thursday, April 16, 2009 at 7:00 pm**, Jews, Christians, and Muslims will come together in St. James Cathedral for a service of readings, music and prayer to remember the Holocaust. The service is co-sponsored by Temple De Hirsch Sinai, the Seattle University School of Theology and Ministry, St. James Cathedral, and the Shemanski Institute for Christian and Jewish Understanding. Holocaust survivors will join Jewish, Christian, and Muslim leaders in the service, which will conclude with a candle-lighting in memory of the six million who lost their lives in the Holocaust.
