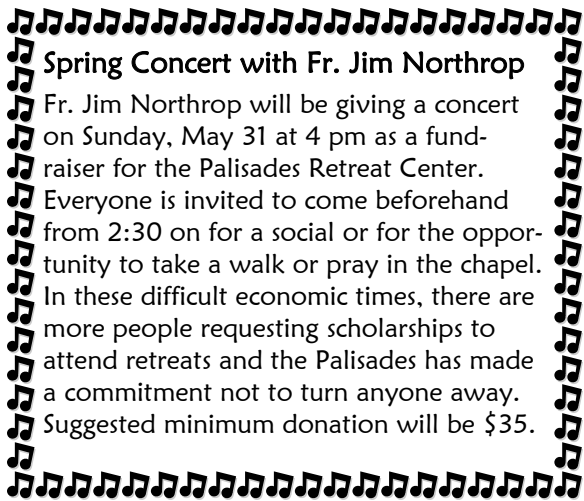

From the Pastoral Coordinator

Thank you top everyone who has already responded to the Annual Catholic Appeal. An important part of our Catholic Faith is supporting the work of our church, not only in our own parish, but also the work of the Archdiocese and the wider world. The Annual Catholic Appeal supplies not only for the day-to-day operations of the Archdiocesan offices, but also for the many outreach ministries to people need through hospitals, nursing homes and emergency services. It also provides for long-term programs such as seminarian education, priests' healthcare, and support for the religious sisters who have served our communities for so many years.

Our goal is 100% participation—to have every parish household support the work of our Archdiocese. Please consider making a pledge of at least \$1 a day—\$365. Recognizing that not everyone will be able to do this, those who are able to pledge more are asked to do so. Every pledge is appreciated. If you are not able to pledge anything financially, please make a pledge to pray for the work of the Archdiocese—and fill out an envelope indicating that you will do so. This is a very meaningful way to support our church's ministry!

If we surpass our Archdiocesan assigned goal, then the money donated above that amount is rebated to the parish. **This year, the rebate will be dedicated toward the purchase of a new sound system for our church.** As you know, our current system is inadequate. We need a high quality system that will provide good sound throughout the church, enabling all of us—including our senior parishioners and those with hearing impairments—to participate fully with our community. We are told that such a system would cost about \$15,000. So, our overall goal for the Annual Catholic Appeal is \$69,000. This is ambitious, but certainly feasible, if everyone does what we are able. Thank you for your participation and support.
