Blessing of New Crucifix

September 19 - 20

Our parish will mark another milestone in our church renovation with the arrival and blessing of our new crucifix next week-end. As announced earlier

this summer, artist Alexandre Safonov has been commissioned to carve the corpus. Mr. Safonov has been carving sacred art since the 1970s, first in his native Russia and for the past two decades here in the United States. He has designed an original life-sized corpus for St. Anne, which will be mounted on a ten-foot cross and hung at the east end of the church, near the baptismal font. It will be blessed during the liturgies on September 19 & 20, and parishioners will be able to view the crucifix at eye level after Mass. The following week it will be raised and positioned on the wall at the east end of the church.

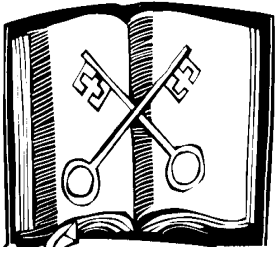
