The Holiday's Are Coming!

Before we know it, Advent and Christmas Seasons will arrive. There are some projects that need to be completed to prepare the decorations for these festive seasons.

- ✚ New Banners need to be sewn: if you can sew and/or iron a straight seam, your talents are needed. We will gather with our sewing machines on an agreeable date and complete four 24' Christmas banners.
- ✚ A simple box platform and a couple of smaller boxes need to be built to help display the Crèche. Simple carpentry and painting skills are all that is required.
- ✚ Preparing the decorations for the church: some of the decorations we use during the Christmas season are artificial (as they meet fire codes much easier), and these include our wreaths. They need to be "fluffed" and decorated.
- ✚ Our Christmas tree (12') will need to be picked-up and brought to the church from east King County about a week before Christmas.
- ✚ Ornaments for our Christmas tree: we need ideas for simple ornaments that families and individuals could make and bring in for the Christmas tree.
- ✚ Individuals and families to help decorate the church for Christmas.

We also need to replace our artificial tree that is used for our Giving Tree during Advent. The one we have used for the past decade is literally falling apart. If you have a **7' or 8' tree** you no longer use and could donate, or would like to help purchase one, that would be great!

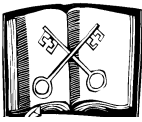
Facility Focus:

Greetings;

I wanted to update the St. Anne Community on the progress towards installing a new sound system in the sanctuary here. As you recall, the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal rebate will go towards that much overdo project. To date, the appeal rebates total \$9,807.50 through the end of September. If all those who pledged pay their total commitments, we would receive a total of \$26,251.00.

With the assistance of our music director: Paul Kramer, we have entertained numerous presentations from local companies to provide us with a long-term solution to the unique challenges of our space. The 4 to 5 second delay in echoes is a huge obstacle to overcome, but we feel that there are some applications that will solve the selection dilemma between a “distributed” versus a “cluster” system. Our investigation has taken us to similar environments to evaluate which will work best for us. We have also solicited the help from the architect of the new system at St. Joseph’s on Capitol Hill. Our hope is to have the system ready for the Christmas season. Help us reach our rebate goal by making good on your generous pledges to the archdiocesan annual appeal. Thank you for all you do for the St. Anne Parish & School!

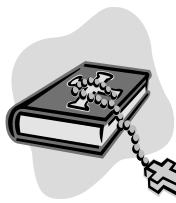
Altar of Remembrance and Book of the Dead

History and Current Affairs. The monthly envelope package always includes a goldenrod colored envelope for the **Timothy McCarthy Endowment Fund**. This endowment will be a significant piece of St. Anne School's financial future but many of us have no idea of its origins and purpose.

The Timothy McCarthy Scholarship Fund was established in 1981 in memory of Pat and Gretchen McCarthy's son, who died in August 1980, prior to his 8th grade year at St. Anne School. It started with a \$1,000 contribution. In 1996, it became the McCarthy Endowment Fund to which the school contributes yearly from the school's Annual Fund donations. When the fund reaches \$1,000,000, the school will withdraw the yearly interest for use in its operating budget. The goal is to help stabilize tuition. Currently, the fund is at \$713,000.
