## Liturgy Questions: Why do we stand after receiving communion?

The Catholic Mass culminates with the Eucharist. The reception of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ is what all the Mass has pointed to up to this point. This is a joyous and sacred moment, one that gives some the desire to go back to the pew and pray silently. So then, why does the Church call us to stand and sing?

At this point in the liturgy, all of us are engaged in one of the three major processions of the Mass. This is the corporate part of communion – the ritual action of coming to the Table in a deliberate manner as the people of God gathered. It is a symbol of our unity in faith. So we continue to stand and sing until all have received and any remaining consecrated hosts have been taken to the Tabernacle. It is also a very personal action, and so each person is served individually using the words “Body (Blood) of Christ” and the response “Amen” to publically acknowledge our belief in what we are receiving.

After all have received we have the opportunity to sit or kneel during the Grand Silence before the prayer that concludes our Communion Rite. This is our time for personal reflection or to give thanks for the transformation Sacrament in which we have participated.
