Principal Search Update

For the past two weeks, the principal search committee has been focused on gathering information from the parish school community. Parents were invited to complete an informational survey and 63 responses were received. Faculty and staff were also asked to complete a survey and invited to attend listening sessions with search committee members.

The search committee met on Saturday, March 6th, compiled and reviewed community input and then used that information to develop a list of hiring criteria. We want to thank all those who participated in the information gathering phase - the feedback received has been very thoughtful and is extremely valuable to the process. Using archdiocesan requirements and the criteria developed from parent / staff information gathering as our guideline, the committee is beginning to review applications from the pool of those who have applied. We will be meeting next week to determine who will be selected for initial interviews.

We will continue to keep you posted as the process continues. Please pray with us - that we all remain present to the guidance of the Holy Spirit as we seek a new principal for St. Anne School. Thank you!
