## Liturgy Questions: **Tridu - what?**

Holy Week begins next Sunday and with it comes the end of Lent and celebration of Triduum [tri-doo-um] the biggest feast of the whole year for Catholics. But what is it? Most of us know what it is, but not the name. Triduum is the three day feast comprised of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter. These are the most holy days of our calendar as we remember the death and resurrection of Christ. Yes, it is one feast which is celebrated over three days not three separate liturgies.

In order to understand the days, we enter into the Jewish way of acknowledging the beginning and end of days. Their Sabbath begins at sundown and it is this marking of time that informs the celebration of Triduum. The feast begins on Day One with Holy Thursday, when we are called to remember the last supper and the institution of Eucharist as the sign of the new covenant with God. Scripture tells us that after the supper, Jesus and the disciples go to the Garden for the night, where he is arrested, tried overnight and in the morning hours turned over to Pilate. Jesus is then crucified. His disciples are allowed to take the body which is quickly laid in a nearby tomb as the sun is soon to set.

Good Friday is Day Two, and because he was laid in the tomb before sunset it is the second day of his death. This is the only day of the year that a Catholic Mass is not celebrated anywhere in the world. We fast and abstain. In the afternoon, Stations of the Cross are prayed at about the time of day Jesus was crucified. At the Solemn Service of the Lord's Passion, on the second day of Triduum, we venerate the cross and receive communion consecrated the day before. It is a solemn service, a time of quiet reflection. The evening service ushers in the Third Day of Jesus' death.

Holy Saturday is spent in prayer and anticipation. As this Third Day of unfolds, the Church prepares to gather after sundown and keep vigil. Soon, the sense of separation will end, but for now, like the women at the tomb, we keep vigil in awe and wonder.

Sundown and the Easter Vigil begins a day of celebration of the Resurrection, with the new fire, readings, the baptism of the Elect, the reception of the Candidates, and the celebration of the Eucharist. To vigil is to wait, and so the Mass is longer, full of symbols and images. It is full of the joy of Christ's Resurrection. It is the final piece of Triduum. Three days.
