We are pleased to announce the St. Anne Servizio Award sponsored for the first time this year by the annual St. Anne Parish Italian Dinner. Servizio means 'Service' in Italian, and this scholarship award has been initiated to honor the longstanding legacy of service that is embodied by our parish community and to acknowledge and support the commitment to lifelong service in the Roman Catholic tradition that so many of our students are developing.
