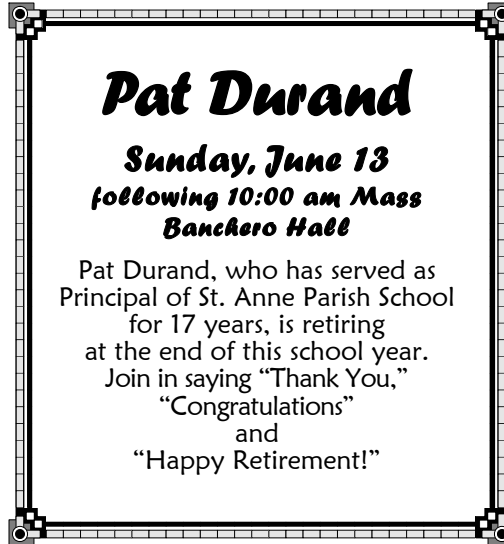

RCIA : for those interested in becoming **CATHOLIC**

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the Catholic Church's way of welcoming new members into our faith community. At St. Anne Parish, it is an on-going year-round process that may be joined at any time.

Who may participate?

- Those who have never been baptized;
- Those baptized in a different Christian denomination;
- Those baptized Catholic, but not raised in the church.

How long does it take to become a Catholic?

For non-baptized persons (catechumens), the timing is determined by the fact that adult baptism is celebrated only once a year at the Easter Vigil. For those who have already been baptized in another Christian denomination (candidates), the timing depends on how familiar they are with Catholic teaching and life.

What does the process involve?

Sessions are held year-round on Sunday mornings. Beginning at 9 am with a session of instruction, sharing and discussion. Then during the 10 am Mass, catechumens and candidates are sent forth with the prayers of the assembly to reflect on the Sunday readings. Mass ends at about 11 am.

What topics are discussed?

The weekly sessions cover a broad range of topics, explored in ways that help us better live out our faith in our daily lives. Some of the topics covered are:

- What do Catholics believe about being "saved"?
- How can I understand the Bible correctly?
- What are the sacraments and what do they do?
- What do Catholics believe about Mary and the saints?
- How can I learn how to pray?

If I begin, am I obligated to become Catholic?

There is no obligation to make any commitment, nor is pressure exerted on anyone to become Catholic. We would hope that you would gain a deeper appreciation and understanding of Catholic beliefs and practices, regardless of your decision.

What's the next step?

If you—or someone you know—is interested in learning more about the Catholic faith, please consider participating in the RCIA process.
