New Banners for our Church

If all goes according to plan, two new banners will be hanging in our church this weekend. These were created over the past few months by our own St. Anne parishioners.

The banners were made using a unique paper-cutting technique that creates negative space on the paper, producing a positive image in the eye of the beholder. The project began with blank photographer's backdrop paper, which was painted with two washes and topped with a latex paint. The color was selected to complement the walls and woods in our worship space.

The paper was then flipped over and the two images were sketched on the white side of the paper. The images were then plotted out to indicate which pieces of the paper needed to be cut out in order to produce the negative image. (Cuts cannot be too large, or too close together, so as not to threaten the integrity of the paper and cause tearing.) Each of the marked spaces was then carefully cut out using Exacto knives. Each banner contains approximately 1500 cuts.

Our new banners are each 17 by 6 feet. One depicts our patron saint, St. Anne, mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary and grandmother of our Lord. One of her hands rests on the shoulder of her young daughter; in the other she holds our parish church.

The other banner depicts St. Joachim, the husband of St. Anne and father of Mary. According to tradition, Joachim was a shepherd who raised sheep used for the sacrificial offerings in the Temple. In the banner Joachim carries a young lamb in his arm, and holds a censor in his hand.

The border at the top and bottom of each banner incorporates symbols from our church's stained glass windows: the star from the Old Testament window on the west end of the church; the lily from the New Testament window in the south transept; and the flame from the Church history window in the day chapel.
