- Martha's Workers prepared 24,000 sandwiches and delivered them to St. Martin de Porres Shelter, Francis House, Queen Anne Food Bank, Noel House for Women, and Bitter Lake (after school care for children). The weekly average of volunteers was 13 to 20.
- St. Martin's Meal Program at Our Lady of Fatima has supported St. Martin de Porres Shelter since 2006, at first by providing overnight housing at the Parish. They have made at least 3,500 meals a year since 2020.

The volunteer team continues to grow. Currently, there are **49 meal volunteer families** on a rotating schedule, including several new families from St. Anne, and **9 dedicated bus drivers** who deliver the meals to St. Martin's. We anticipate donating over 4,000 meals this coming fiscal year.



Facilities and Grounds Recap

SACRED HEART OF JESUS

Hand railings on altar: New railings on the Sacred Heart of Jesus sanctuary and altar were purchased thanks to a generous benefactor and to everyone who donated towards the ACA 2025!

Emergency repairs: In spring 2024 during our first big rain of the season, there was a leak from the roof into the school building, which resulted in the growth of some mold. Abatement, clean-up, and restoration cost over \$20,000 over the past year.

Queen Anne Food Bank: We began the project of transitioning the management of the Queen Anne Food Bank to Catholic Community Services of Western Washington. This will allow it to grow further to meet the increasing needs in our greater community

Access and parking: Accessing the parking lot is a challenge especially when there are events at the Climate Pledge Arena. After close consultation with parking and transportation directors at the Climate Pledge Arena, we instituted a new start time of thirty minutes earlier for the Sunday evening Mass. Additionally, the parking lot was restriped by staff.

OUR LADY OF FATIMA

Heating: As another fiscal year draws to a close, we will soon be reaping the benefits of the significant repair and restoration of the boiler. The work included installation of a new state-ofthe-art digital control system as well as new gas valves and motor. The cost of these repairs was significant at \$56,000, which included a total cleaning of the boiler's interior, repair of refractory material cracks, and new boiler end gaskets. This will ensure the comfort of our parishioners during the winter months and provide the right climate for the integrity of our musical instruments and buildings.

Grounds: Last summer we undertook the much-needed task of resurfacing the church and school parking lots. At a \$10,000 cost to the church, we were able to repair the broken asphalt and now enjoy a smoother and safer driving surface.

Due to rising costs, our parish spent \$23,000 on services for our grounds and lawn in 2024-2025. We have suspended the current schedule and look forward to setting out a new plan for the next fiscal year that is costeffective in the maintenance of our beautiful grounds. We are grateful to our facilities team who are keeping up appearances for us in the interim.

General repair: Earlier this year there was very audible static emitting from one of our tower speakers; this was successfully repaired.

ST. ANNE

St. Francis garden: We completed the project of adding lighting and seating. This was made possible by funds raised with the 2023 ACA campaign.

Roof repairs: Funds from the 2024 ACA were distributed to us as a rebate towards roof repair. In summer 2025, we replaced the roof on the west annex of the church, which was the area in most urgent need. Thank you to everyone who generously donated towards the ACA and to this project!

Campus clean-ups: We had two leaf clean-ups as well as an Earth Day crew who worked to maintain our campus. Nearly 60 volunteers helped.

Church door access: The broken keycard system at St. Anne was replaced with added security and convenience utilizing codes and scheduled unlock times.

Baptismal font: A minor leak in a drain valve for the baptismal font was fixed so it should now be keeping its water level more consistently. We will continue to monitor it.

Heating improvement in the parish office: The heating system was updated. Also, the door access system between the office and the church was fixed to allow the door to remain closed, resulting in heating efficiency improvements.










How many people are there in your household?

Summary of other data points

St. Anne School

More than a century after its opening, St. Anne School continues to be a place of learning, joy, community, and faith. In partnership with parents and the parish family, our mission remains strong: to provide a quality Catholic education that promotes educational excellence, fosters the living of Gospel values, builds Christian community, and inspires compassionate service.

In 2024, Pre-Kindergarten became fully licensed as a full-day program, and the school began offering aftercare for up to 50 students in grades Pre-K through 4th grade. We also completed the accreditation process: a self-study that takes place every six years and analyzes the school's programs, highlights our strengths, determines areas for growth, and helps us plan for our future. We enter the next century as a strong, faith-filled community, committed to providing a quality Catholic education for all of our students.
